- WHEREAS**, the A.S.I. promotes student interest and rights through advocacy, programming, and representation on university-wide committees; and
- WHEREAS**, the vision statement for the A.S.I. 2011-2012 administration expresses our intention of “building an active campus culture with visible representation and a quality educational experience;” and
- WHEREAS**, CSULA is classified as a commuter campus, which can challenge the growth of a strong campus identity and holistic university experience; and
- WHEREAS**, there is a gap in communication between the students, faculty, and administrators on the CSULA campus; let it be
- RESOLVED**, that the A.S.I. encourages faculty and administrator assistance in developing and improving our campus culture and community; and let it also be
- RESOLVED**, that the A.S.I. supports and would like to discuss needed faculty and administrator involvement and collaboration with A.S.I. representatives to further enhance the educational experience of the students; and let it further be
- RESOLVED**, that copies of this Resolution be distributed widely, including, but not limited to the California State University, Los Angeles Academic Senate, all A.S.I. offices in the CSU system, CSULA President James M. Rosser, the CSULA University Times, and the Academic Senate of the California State University.
